School Absence

Absence for any reason, please notify the school office either by phone 01903 785416 or email school@stmargaretsprimary.org.uk

May I remind you that Headteachers are NOT allowed by law to authorise absence in term time except for 'exceptional circumstances.' Children are in school for 190 days per year. Holidays in term time cannot be included as 'exceptional circumstances' except in very rare cases. As such Headteachers are not permitted to authorise such absences and the Local Authority (NOT the school) may issue a fine.

In the exceptional case where you may have to request absence from school please complete the form available on the school's website or from the school office at least one month in advance of the first date of absence.

Uniform




When your child is out and about on a bicycle or scooter please make sure that you speak to your child about being sensible and to be aware of the traffic. We would advise helmets to be worn.

St Margaret's Church News

A very warm welcome awaits families from the school at any of our services and events that the Church offers.

Child-friendly family services take place every week on Sundays in St Margaret's Church building (at the bottom of Arundel Road) at 10am and 5pm. Each service lasts just over an hour, and the children go out to groups most weeks after 15 mins in the service. There is a creche for under 3 year olds and then groups for children aged 4-11 at the 10am. At the 5pm, there is no creche, but groups for 4 to 10 year olds and also a group of 11-13 year olds. All are very welcome to attend, whether you are used to Church, or just exploring.

If you have a child who has just started Reception, we are hosting a party for parents, your child, and any siblings on Saturday 16th September from 2-3:30pm in the Rectory, Rectory Lane, Angmering (BN16 4JU). A great way to meet one another, and to meet members of the Church community. Please let Chris Wilson, our children, youth and families minister (contact details below) if you haven't yet told us that you can come.

As from next week, Chris Wilson is running a lunchtime club (called 'Lighthouse') for years 3-4 (Wednesday 12:30 until 1 pm) and years 5-6 (Thursday 12:30 until 1 pm). We talk about bible topics explored in assembly and give kids the opportunity to explore their own faith.

If you have children in school years 5 to 8, we run a group called Adventurers. We find this balance of having older primary and younger secondary to be really helpful for building relationships and helping the younger ones prepare for secondary school. We meet during term time in St Margaret's Church hall from 7-8:15 pm on Tuesday nights with a mix of games, challenges, activities and Bible input. Anyone is welcome to attend.

Looking ahead, we are looking forward to having some Harvest themed assemblies for children from the school on Wednesday 4th October in Church. The assembly for children from school years 4,5 and 6 will start at 9:15am, and for children in years 1,2 and 3 at 10am.

Another opportunity to celebrate Harvest on Sunday 1st October in Church at 10am. On this occasion, we will worship together with everyone staying in for a child centred service.

Christmas – a full programme including performances of a Pantomime 'A lad in a manger' on 9th December, a family carol service on 17th December, and Christingle services on Christmas Eve, and Christmas Day celebration are being planned. WhatsApp

Whilst WhatsApp's minimum age is 16, statistics show that over half of those who use the app are 3 years to 17 years old. Group chats are the main concern when it comes to children under 16 years old using WhatsApp.

Why should we be concerned?

There's a risk of bullying, particularly in group chats.


There's a risk of seeing content of a sexual nature, or showing violence and hatred.

There's a threat to safety if your child shares their live location, particularly with people they don't know in person.

They may receive spam or hoax messages.

In group chats, any users who aren't in your child's contacts can see messages they post in the group, and your child will be able to see messages they post.

We ask that you carefully monitor what your child is viewing online and that they are reminded that they must tell you if they receive anything inappropriate. We have included a guide on "The dangers of group chats and WhatsApp" to help frame these conversations (see separate attachment sent with email).
