Our Special Support Centre – Buildings Update

We are about half way through our exciting building project at the front of the school. Our new building will be a Special Support Centre for children in the locality with Social Communication needs (Autistic spectrum). Whilst the centre is *based* at St Margaret's the local Authority decides on admissions to the centre. The centre is due to open in January 2024 and will eventually support up to 12 children. It will be called "The Tomlin Centre" – named after a generous benefactor to St Margaret's CE primary School who lived in Angmering for many years.

I am delighted to announce that we have appointed a new Centre Manager who will run the centre from January 2024.

Mrs Mary Ballingal has joined the St Margaret's team from 1st September. Mrs Ballingal worked in both mainstream and SEND schools in West Sussex for 9 years before moving to a specialist school where she worked as class teacher and outreach manager. During this time she advised other schools and mainstream colleagues to support pupils in their setting to be successful and happy learners. This involved training all teachers and support staff, running workshops and modelling best practice.

School Matters!



Attendance Matters

You will no doubt have seen that there is an attendance crisis in schools across the country.

Attendance at school is not only a legal requirement but <u>essential</u> for children's learning and welfare. Far too many families are taking holidays during term time. We recognise that holidays in term time are cheaper than during school holidays but that is nothing new – it's always been the case. However, there is a far greater cost than the financial saving when taking holidays in term time. Children who are away for a week do NOT lose a week of schooling - they lose *at least* 2 weeks. We plan our curriculum to be progressive and build on the previous weeks' learning. When children return to school after time out in term time they have missed previous work and are not able to catch up as the class have already moved to the next part of the learning journey. Topics started in the week of their absence mean that they have lost that important introduction and often flounder in the weeks following a break in attendance.

This has a very negative effect on both learning and morale. It cannot be made up.

It's absolutely understandable that children who are unwell should have time off school. Some children are susceptible to colds and chest infections etc.

However, some parents believe that attendance at 90% for other reasons than illness is satisfactory! This represents on average a day off school *every* fortnight – apart from lost education this is a very poor life lesson for children. A child with 90% attendance each year will have lost a whole year at school over a 10 year period. Throughout this week (and indeed every week following the 6 week summer holiday) I have received a clutch of Absence from Learning in Term Time forms. All of them are for holidays – some for extended periods. This time cannot be made up – this learning for your child has been forfeited. Such absence is lost learning for your child, disruptive for the class and demoralising for teachers. I would ask you to think very carefully before thinking about taking time off school for all the reasons stated.

Communications with Teachers

Please be reminded that if you wish to speak to your child's class teacher, they are available at the end of the day as they release children from the various gates around the school. Teachers are always happy to make contact with you if you have something you want to let them know or some questions. Alternatively, you can email your child's class teacher but please be aware that these emails are only monitored between 8.30am and 5.30pm. Evening and weekend emails cannot be answered outside reasonable working hours. This includes messages on Seesaw or Tapestry.

The class emails follow the format eg. oak@stmargaretsprimary.org.uk; badger@stmargaretsprimary.org.uk etc. It is essential that you do not use the class email to report a child's absence but to email the school office instead or phone (01903 785416) and leave a message.

- Manage all school messages in one place
- Manage communications for more than one child, across different schools, with one ParentMail account

We appreciate everybody has busy lives but even a few hours every now and again to help our PTA would be gratefully appreciated.







