English Learning

In English, we will be looking at the text Street Child (linked to the Victorians). We will:

- Find out about homelessness, take notes and produce a non-fiction leaflet
- Write our own ending to the story, using clues from the text

We will then look at the work of Charles Dickens. We will learn:

- To read and follow a play script
- To perform a scene from Oliver Twist
- To summarise a Dickens's story

Mathematical Learning

This half term we are looking at:

- * Consolidating addition and subtraction formal methods
- * Learning formal methods for multiplication and division
- * Statistics and interpreting data
- * Consolidating number and place value






PSHE Learning

French Learning

We will be learning about Nursery Rhymes as part of our Victorian topic, and continuing to learn to sing the song 'Livin' on a Prayer' by Bon Jovi.



Faith and Wonder Learning

We will be looking at the unit "Incarnation" this half term. We will also be performing the Godly Play 'The Circle of the Church Year.'

Computing Learning

We will be looking at self-identity and online relationships, thinking about how we can keep safe when online.

PE Learning

For our indoor PE we will be engaging in fitness activities and for our outdoor sessions we will be playing invasion games.



How can you help?

- Encouraging your child to read regularly at home, both independently and to an adult. Comprehension is a key part of the children's reading development so asking lots of questions when you hear your child read is really beneficial for this.
- Lots of regular times table testing including both multiplication and division facts.
- Supporting your child with learning their spellings, discussing the meanings of words, discussing the phoneme and any spelling rules, and reviewing spellings from previous weeks.
