#### **English Learning**

In English, we will be focusing on Poetry and continuing our class book The Nowhere Emporium. Our poetry work will lead on to debating and writing a persuasive speech.



#### Mathematical Learning

This term we are looking at:

- Area and Perimeter
- Shape and Angles
- Statistics



#### PSHE Learning

This half term we will be concluding our topic of "Safety and the Changing Body". This will include some basic First Aid knowledge alongside Relationship & Sexual Education. We will then move on to the topic of "Citizenship" with a focus on human rights, diversity and democracy.



### French Learning


We will be learning vocabulary for objects "en classe" (in the classroom).



#### Scientific Learning


This half term we will be continuing our focus on electricity.
