Dear Parents and Carers,

May we begin by welcoming you and your children to the Early Years at St. Margaret's School. The children have had a fantastic first week in school and we have enjoyed getting to know them! We have detailed below some important information;

Communication

Communication between home and school is very important to us so we just wanted to clarify which method to use for what.

Seesaw



Seesaw is primarily used to record your child's learning journey, however we also use this method to communicate Early Years specific messages and weekly memos.

Hopefully, most of you will now be up and running with our wonderful online journal 'Seesaw' and are enjoying seeing all the exciting and lovely things your child has been up to! Over the coming weeks our focus will be getting to know your child, therefore we will be 'stepping back' from our iPads to spend more time with your child.

We encourage you to upload photos of your child from home of anything you feel may be relevant to their learning journal. For example; your child using an iPad at home, cooking, gardening or a special visit. If you are having problems with your account or need some more assistance with this, please email Seesaw@stmargaretsprimary.org.uk. We would also like to remind you that under no circumstances should pictures/video containing children other than your own, be shared on social media or in the public domain.

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Parent drop-ins

We would like to extend a warm welcome to parents and carers to drop in and see us informally after school every Wednesday. Our classrooms will be open from after children are collected (around 3:05) until 3:30pm. This is great opportunity to come and see us if you have any questions or want to share any information. You will also be able to help your child pick choosing books to bring home and see what is going on in class.

House Groups

At St. Margaret's all the children are placed in one of four houses (red/blue/green/yellow). The children can receive a house point token for something positive e.g. tidying, helping, being kind, doing some super writing etc. These are put in tubes in the classroom, then every Friday, the tubes are tipped into large colour tubes in our office area. At the end of the half term, whichever colour has the most tokens will have a treat e.g. wear their own house colour clothes to school for a day. We also use the groupings throughout the day in Early Years and in organising their belongings e.g. red house book bag box. Look out for the seesaw post telling you which house team your child is in. Siblings should be in the same house colour group.

Reading books



Choosing books - Today your child should have brought home what we call a 'choosing book' in their book bag. These books are intended as a book to share together, read by an adult to the child. Your child can change their choosing book whenever they like or if you want to help them choose a new book please come along to our parent drop-in on Wednesday afternoons.

Reading scheme books - These books are for the children to read **to you** - your child's 'learning to read' books. Staff in school will change these books, as they are carefully selected to suit the needs of your child. Over this half term, we will establish your child's readiness to read and they will be given a reading scheme book when appropriate. Initially, this may be a picture book without words, to encourage discussion about stories and language skills. This book should be read at school then again at home. Your child's book will be changed when they have developed confidence with it.

Reading diary - These will be sent out with your child's first reading scheme book. This is a book where any adults at home or in school can record when they have read with your child and make supportive comments on how they have got on. Please record the date, title and a short comment signed by the adult.



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P.E.

Please send in PE kits by the end of next week. This should be in a draw string bag or small backpack and should all be clearly labelled with your child's name. Please also include spare pants and socks for your child.

Labelling

Please ensure that all items of clothing, etc (including shoes) are clearly labelled with your child's name so that we can return them if they become lost or misplaced.

Healthy snack



As some of you may be aware, for several years our school has been able to provide free fruit and vegetables to all infant children through a government healthy eating programme. The scheme provides children with an additional serving of fruit or vegetables, which will be offered in the afternoon during story time. However, we also ask that children bring a piece of fruit, cut ready to for them to eat where necessary, into school to eat at our morning snack time. Please note grapes must be cut in half length ways.

Birthdays

When it is your child's birthday they can wear their 'own' clothes to school for the day. We are happy to distribute invitations and birthday sweets/treats for the class. We enjoy celebrating birthdays and will sing to your child in class.

Reception Baseline Assessment (RBA)

By half term, each child will have completed a new government statutory baseline assessment. The children will not be told it's an assessment and it will be delivered to them in the course of their normal day-to-day activities.
