Lexia users: Remember to use some of your home learning time to work your way up the stages of Lexia. We are so impressed with those children that have been completing level after level.		
Reading	Select one of these questions to answer about your book. Write a detailed response, ensure you think about the quality of your writing, including the use of complex sentences. - Does this book make you think of anything that has happened to you? If so, what? - What is the most important point in this story? -In what ways does the author make you feel as if you were there?	
Spelling	Have a look at your English packs, page 53. Look at the learning: 'ed' and 'ing' change the tense of a verb. Read through this section and think about what it is teaching you. Have a good think and digest the information. Discuss other examples with your family, if you can. Task: Use new examples for -ED and for -ING to help you write out an explanation for a friend, who is visiting from France. They are getting really good at speaking English and they love coming over to England. Unfortunately, they are struggling a bit with their writing because we have a lot of confusing spelling rules. <i>Please help them out with this rule.</i> Super Challenge: most of us have a few words that we know we can't spell. Use this time to get these words in your head. Post-it note your bedroom. Write them on separate pieces of paper and get someone to hide them round the house and make up a game from there.	
<image/>	<u>Imaginary Worlds</u> Now that you have discussed the various imaginary worlds that some very imaginative individuals have created, we would like you to pick one. This might be your favourite and hopefully one you know the most about. Feel free to do some research if you don't already know much. Your task is to draw this world. This might be in the form of a map with different locations or you could draw a couple of different locations in detail. Once drawn we would like you to write a few sentences to describe what you have drawn. Your focus should be adjectives with well thought out descriptive	
	vocabulary. Look up in your English packs the pages on adjectives to support your learning. Remember the importance of handwriting and writing in full sentences. Think carefully about your sentences showing off	

your understanding of grammar and spelling rules.
