Britain had been tested to the limit by the Second World War. It was the first **total war**, where civilians were targeted at home as much as soldiers on the battlefield, and every aspect of life in Britain was geared towards winning the war.





In 1940, there was a real possibility of Nazi Germany invading Britain, when she **stood alone** with the Empire against the might of the German Army. Over 67,000 civilians were **killed** during the war as well as 384,000 soldiers. Food, clothing, petrol and even soap were **rationed** and families were **separated** through evacuation, military service and war work.
