<p>Reading</p> 	<p>As it is VE Day tomorrow, we thought it would be good for you to learn a bit about why it is such a special day. Read through the information added to the website and then have a go at answering the questions. We have included the answers so you can check your work at the end - No cheating!</p>
<p>Spelling</p> 	<p>This week, we would like to you to make a list of words which end with 'tion' and play a few games of hangman with them. Here are four words to get you started: station, donation, decoration, information.</p>
<p>English task</p>	<p>Continuing our theme on VE Day, we have uploaded some PowerPoint Presentations with information about VE Day. Have a read through and see if you can create a poster of information that would tell someone who didn't know about VE Day, why it is celebrated. Remember the features of a poster: Facts written in short, snappy sentences, punctuation, pictures, eye-catching title. When finished, why not put them up in your window and/or share them on Google Classroom for everyone to see!</p>

Add your score in to your red book or play with the Times Table cards you made last week.</p>
<p>Maths task</p> 	<p>Adding on time - Make a clock (if you have not already done so) out of a paper plate or a paper circle with a short hour hand and a long minute hand, attached with a split pin or blue tack. Then use it to help you add on time. Try this game, https://mathsframe.co.uk/en/resources/resource/119/find_the_start_time#</p> <p>Or your adult could give you challenges e.g. My lunch break is at 12.10, it takes an hour, what time do I finish? Scooby doo ends at 3.20, it is 20 min long, what time did it start? I start reading at 2.05 and finish at 2.30. How long did I read for?</p> <p><i>Remember, if your child is still finding reading the time to the nearest minute tricky, do not worry. Stick to last week's work. If they do not have a secure understanding of how to tell the time, they can not solve problems about it. Referring to the time and getting them to tell the time in everyday life is the best way for them to learn</i></p> <p>Challenge - Try these challenges on BBC bitesize. https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/zd3q2sg (The answers are there if you need them!)</p>

If you are feeling really brave you could video yourself singing your song or another celebration song and add it to Google Classroom. Have fun!</p>
<p>VE Day Extras</p> 	<p>Tomorrow, lots of people will be celebrating VE Day by having tea parties in their gardens. Why not host your own tea party with your teddies or create a model one out of Lego?</p> <p>You may also like to research and then play some wartime games.</p>
