Reading



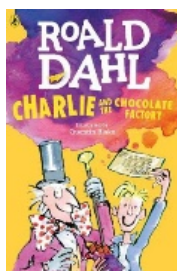
Read some of your reading book and write in your reading diary. Use your bookmark to answer 2 questions. Write the questions and your answers in your red book.

Spelling



This week, we would like to you think about what happens when you add the suffix 'ly' to words. What do you already know about words that end in 'ly'? Can this suffix be added to any word? Have a go at selecting some words that 'ly' can be added to and think about what type of words these are. Write them in your red book and then play hangman with them.

English task



Last week, we asked you to finish writing the final 2 paragraphs of your missing chapter from Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. Before handing in any work, we always like to edit it to make sure it is the very best that we can do. In school, we would normally visit our 'editing tables' but we can't do that now. So, we would like you to spend 7 minutes on each category looking and checking that you are happy with them:

1. Capital letters
2. Full stops
3. Interesting punctuation - commas, speech marks, exclamation or question marks
4. Spellings
5. Exciting word/phrase choices - adjectives, adverbs, similes, alliteration

If you have written your story on paper, or printed it out, use your **purple pen** to make any changes. If you have typed your missing chapter, can you change the font to **purple** to show where you have made any changes?

If your child is still finding reading the time to the nearest minute tricky, do not worry. Stick to last week's work. It is more important that they can read to the time to the nearest minute than to use the 24hour clock. Time is tricky, some children grab it straight away and others take a long time! Referring to the time and getting them to tell the time in everyday life is the best way for them to learn. There are some worksheets which they could complete if you would like

them to.

This clock and table show the corresponding hours on a 24 hour clock.



00:00 = 12:00 AM	12:00 = 12:00 PM
01:00 = 1:00 AM	13:00 = 1:00 PM
02:00 = 2:00 AM	14:00 = 2:00 PM
03:00 = 3:00 AM	15:00 = 3:00 PM
04:00 = 4:00 AM	16:00 = 4:00 PM
05:00 = 5:00 AM	17:00 = 5:00 PM
06:00 = 6:00 AM	18:00 = 6:00 PM
07:00 = 7:00 AM	19:00 = 7:00 PM
08:00 = 8:00 AM	20:00 = 8:00 PM
09:00 = 9:00 AM	21:00 = 9:00 PM
10:00 = 10:00 AM	22:00 = 10:00 PM
11:00 = 11:00 AM	23:00 = 11:00 PM
12:00 = 12:00 AM	24:00 = 12:00 PM

Midnight is referred to as both 00:00 and 24:00
