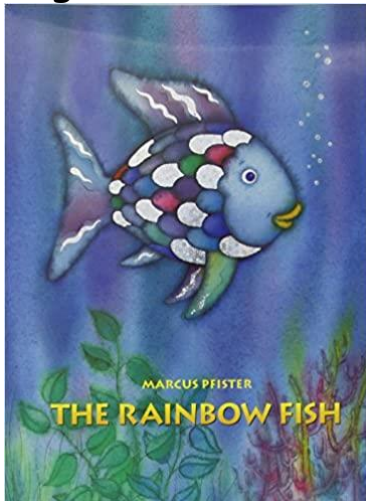
If you're not coming back to school on Friday (or if you're back at school already) we hope you're having a great time with whatever you're up to too.
