Reading

English



Last week, you wrote down some facts about one of the *Really Weird Fish* and one of the deep-sea creatures from *Rainbow Fish Discovers the Deep Sea*.

Today we'd like you to create some **fact boxes** about one of the creatures you researched (or both creatures if you want to).

You will need to:

- * Cut out some fact boxes from the attached sheet (or make your own).
- * Write down your facts in the boxes.
- * Write some **subheadings** to go with your facts e.g. *Fascinating Fact / Where does it live? / How weird?*

On Thursday, you will use your fact boxes and subheadings to create an **information poster** about your creature.

Watch the video by Mrs. Edwards to help you.




Today we are going to do some **division** using the **smiley face method**. You have already done some sharing (dividing) in the Rainbow Fish investigation. Look at the following word problem:

There are 12 toy cars and I want to share them equally between 3 children.

Can you remember the word problem song?

To write the number sentence out it will look like this:
 $12 \div 3 = 4$

To draw some equipment to help us we use the smiley face method:



- * Draw **smiley faces** for the number of people that you are sharing with).
- * **Share circles** to show how many things you are sharing. Remember to **count** the circles as you share them out, then **check** by **counting them again** at the end.
- * Draw "bags" around the circles that each face has. **This is your answer**. (Don't include the face itself inside the ring so that you don't count it by mistake.)

Have a go at completing the sheets (uploaded to the school website). Use the smiley face method to help you. Start with the 1 star questions and work up.
