Once you have these, arrange them, together with your **fact boxes** and **subheadings** on a large sheet of paper. (You could use a double page in your home learning book.) Can you create an eye-catching **layout** that will make people want to find out information from your poster?

Maths



This time we are thinking about **sorting things** into sets, using a **Venn Diagram**. You will need someone to do this activity with you:

- Print off the attached sheets and write your names on one side of the Venn diagram page so that you have a circle each.
- Cut out the pictures of things you might like doing.
- If just one of you likes the activity, stick it in that person's circle.
- If you both like the activity, stick it in the middle part, where your circles overlap.
- If neither of you like the activity, stick it outside the circles.
- Use the blank squares to draw and write some likes of your own that are not in the pictures.

How many likes do you have in common? Were there any surprises? Tell us on SeeSaw how you got on.

What else could you sort into a Venn diagram?
