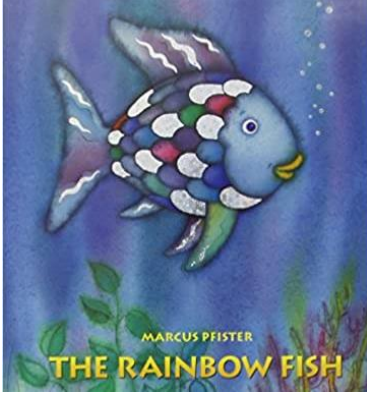

Reading

English



Watch the video on SeeSaw of Mr Carton reading the first part of *The Rainbow Fish*.

In your home learning book, we'd like you to write a **character description** of the Rainbow Fish (the way he is at the beginning of the story). Think about what he **looks** like, how he **feels** and how he **behaves**.

Watch Mr Carton's video for some more ideas for what you can write.

Maths

Starter activity:

Point to a 2-digit number on your 100 square or make it with your number cards. Write it down.

Underneath draw how many tens and how many ones make up this number. You can either draw the 'sausages and peas' or write the 10's and 1's number.

e.g. $43 = 40 + 3$



Today we're going to be **adding two 2-digit numbers** together. Use your number cards to make two 2-digit numbers and **write the addition number sentence** in your book e.g. $43 + 21 =$

If you can work this out **mentally**, then just write the answer. If you can't or just want to check you're right, **draw the Dienes equipment (sausages and peas)** underneath and use them to help you work it out before you write the answer.

Watch Mrs. Edwards' video to help you set it out like we do in school.

Challenge: Can you add three or four 2-digit numbers together? Or a 3-digit number and a 2-digit number?

Today we are, again, thinking about GRATITUDE.

You are going to make a 'Gratitude Alphabet'. You can print off the attached sheet or make your own.

For each letter of the alphabet write down something you're GRATEFUL for. You can decorate your alphabet however you choose!
