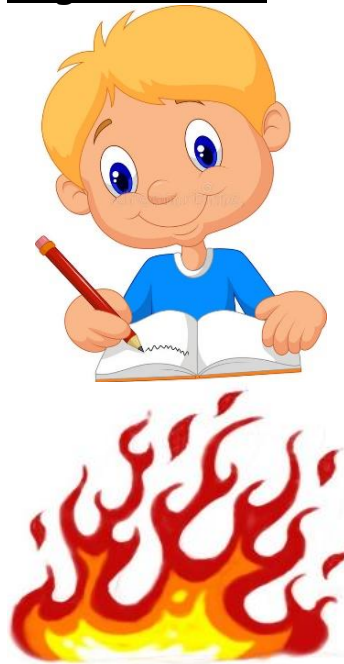
Reading

English / Art



Using your knowledge of **The Great Fire of London** can you make **a double-page poster** in your book, or on a blank piece of paper if you have one? You can **cut out and stick the pictures and title** attached to this document (or make your own). You can also use the **question cards** (follow the instructions on the cover sheet to print them out much smaller) and make them into **lift-up flaps**, and you could **write the answers on the back**? Remember to **organise your poster carefully** before you stick anything down. Try to make it **colourful, eye-catching and informative** to show everything you have learnt about our topic. Have fun and be creative!

Maths



Do you know what **capacity** means? Can you find a measuring jug and use it to fill up different amounts of water? e.g. 100ml (**millilitres**), 500ml, 250ml etc.

Find some empty containers, cups etc. Can you **estimate** (guess) how many millilitres of water they can hold. Then fill them up with water and use the jug to **measure**.

*It is really important to learn how to **estimate** as well as **measure** accurately.*
