



















In your Home School Book, answer these questions:

Telling the time

In class, we learnt about what the **big minute hand** tells us:


- * When it points to the top, it means o'clock
- * When it points to the bottom, it means half past
- * When it points to the right, it means quarter past
- * When it points to the **left**, it means quarter to



<u>Important:</u> The numbers don't matter when the big minute hand is pointing to them; the numbers are to tell us what hour it is when the **small hour hand** is pointing at them.

[&]quot;Past" means what hour it has gone past;

[&]quot;to" means what hour it is going to.
