### Reading



Read a non-fiction book/text for 10 minutes today. It might be a recipe for making a cake or biscuits, or a information book about animals (like dragons), or a set of instructions about how to make something (like a kite). Tell us on SeeSaw or someone in your house what you found out.

#### English / Art



Remember the story of St. George and the dragon? Draw a picture of a huge dragon in your book. Make him as scary and frightening as you can, with lots of detail, like a long, scaly tail; sharp, curved claws; red, fire-breathing mouth; enormous, flapping wings.

Colour him in however you want to: felt tips, paints or collage with shiny paper from your Easter eggs.



Then, underneath, on the lines or around your picture write some **expanded noun phrases** (2 or more adjectives and 1 noun) to describe the terrifying creature! You can steal some of my descriptions from above but try to think of your own as well. Remember to put a **comma** in between the two adjectives!
