




Dear Year 1,

Here are some lovely activities for you to try. These could be done in 10 - 20 min sessions.

<p><u>Reading & Phonics</u></p> 	<p><u>Reading</u> - Read a book for 5-10 minutes today. Sequencing questions you could ask your child. What happens in the beginning of the story? How/where does the story start?</p> <p><u>Phonics</u> - Can you play the days of the week and months of the year games? https://www.roythezebra.com/reading-games/high-frequency-words-days.html</p>
<p><u>Writing</u></p> 	<p><u>Listen to Miss Wilson read the story Fidgety Fish on Seesaw.</u> Speaking and listening - Who are the characters in the story? Can you talk about the beginning, middle and end? Can you retell the story? What was your favourite part? We are learning to write our own sea creature story and we will be writing each part of our story over the next couple of weeks. Story Plan - Divide your page into three parts. Beginning, middle and end. 1. For the beginning think about the main character. What do they look like? What is their personality like? Where does the story start? 2. For the middle think about the adventure the main character is going to have. Does something scary or exciting happen? Is there a problem? Does the character get trapped like Fidgety Fish? Does the character meet another sea creature? 3. Now think about how the story will end. Is the problem solved? Does your character go back home? How is the character feeling? <i>Challenge - To add labels to your story plan.</i></p>
<p><u>Maths</u></p> 	<p><u>Addition & Subtraction - Word Problems</u> Watch the addition video https://vimeo.com/413495632 Can you work out the answers to the word problems? You could pause the video after each question to give yourself time to work out the answer. You could also draw pictures or write number sentences to help solve each problem.</p>
<p><u>Other activities</u> <u>Art and Faith and Wonder</u></p> 	<p><u>Art</u> Can you make a sea creature puppet? You will need some card, a pencil, straw or stick, paint or felt tips, decorations and tape. 1. Put your hand on the piece of card and draw around your hand. 2. Cut out the hand shape. 3. Use felt tips or paint to make your sea creature. 4. Add decorations 5. Attach the straw or stick</p> <p><u>Faith and Wonder</u> Have a look at the examples of Christian symbols. Can you have a go at making some of these or even a rainbow, which is a symbol of hope and promise? You could draw them, paint them, or use pipe cleaners, playdough, salt dough etc.</p>
<p><u>Seesaw App</u></p> 	<p>Have a go at some of the new activities on Seesaw.</p>
