Design an Easter egg

You could use pencils, pens, paints, glitter or collage materials to make a design on paper.

Or you could make a 3D egg from clay, or paint a pebble, or even have a go at blowing out a real egg to use.

What different patterns could you include? See how colourful and bright you can make your design.



Making a cross

**On Good Friday, we remember that Jesus died on the cross for us.
Can you make your own cross?**

You could use:

- lego or other construction toys
- playdough
- twigs
- pipe cleaners
- art and collage materials

Sing some Easter songs

Do you remember this song that we started to learn at school? It's to the tune of '1,2,3,4,5, Once I caught a fish alive'. Can you sing it with your family? (We had to say heav'n to make it fit in!) Do you know any other Easter songs?

(Sing to the tune of '1, 2, 3, 4, 5, Once I Caught a Fish Alive'.)

In heaven, but He hears me pray.



Make an Easter Garden

On Easter Sunday, we celebrate that the tomb was empty because Jesus was alive!

Can you make your own Easter garden to show the cross and the empty tomb?

You could:

- Draw or paint a picture of it
- Make a collage
- Create the scene with playdough
- Use twigs and stones from your garden
