<u>Summer Term Topic – Explore:</u> <u>How did it all begin?</u>

We will be learning:

- About cities and settlements around the world
- Map reading and sketching
- Human and physical geography
- Time-zones
- Latitude and longitude
- Sustainability
- Life in Europe, and North and South America

Our project concepts this term are *community, power, change* and *sustainability.*



English Learning

In English, we will be studying Sophie Anderson's *The House with Chicken Legs.* We will be learning:

- About the themes and motifs in the book
- About poetic devices including meter and rhyme
- How words can make an impact on writing
- Advanced punctuation including colons, semi-colons and parethesis

Mathematical Learning

This half term we will be:

- Continuing our work learning about perimeter and area
- Learning about how we can scale up and scale down lengths and other types of measurements
- Multiplying three numbers together and using this to calculate volume

PSHE Learning

We will be looking at an Economic Wellbeing unit of work. We will thinking about:

- Prioritising needs over wants
- Managing a weekly budget
- Considering the responsibilities of borrowing and loaning
- Recognising the risks and considerations linked with spending online


Music Learning

We will be developing our skills at improvising two pieces of music in different genres. We will learn about intervals between pitches. We will also be asking: How does music shape our way of life?

Science Learning

Our topic this half term will be learning about forces:

- We will carry out experiments into the effects of friction on surfaces, air resistance and water resistance
- We will investigate how mechanisms (such as levers, pulleys and gears) can be used to hour force allow a smaller force to have a greater effect



PE Learning

Lewes class will be focusing on Athletics this half term. We will be working on our jumping, throwing and running techniques.

Amberley will be working on their teamwork skills and knowledge of first aid with Mr Mayne.

In Indoor P.E. both classes are learning gymnastics based around the theme of Space.

Faith and Wonder Learning

We will be looking at our People of God unit of Understanding Christianity. We will be considering the question "How can following God bring freedom and justice?"



French Learning

In French, we will be completing the unit "Boucle D'Or et Les Trois Ours" (Goldilocks and the Three Bears). Children will listen to the familiar fairy tale and learn linked vocabulary.



How can you help?

• Encourage your child to read regularly at home, both independently and to an adult.



- Lots of regular times table testing and quick maths skills following the instructions indicated on the home learning sheets. The faster the response, the better!
- Supporting your child with learning their spellings, discussing the meanings of words, putting them into sentences and reviewing spellings from previous weeks.
