<p>Family project</p> 	<p>Planning a trip! Imagine that you and your family are going to be spending a weekend in London next year (Saturday 18th and Sunday 19th April 2021). You will travel to London Victoria on Saturday morning and return Sunday afternoon. You need to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Decide on three activities that you would like to do and that would interest you e.g. a trip on the London Eye, a tour around the Tower of London • Work out how much the train travel will cost • Allow some money for lunch on both days and dinner on Saturday evening (perhaps even decide where you would like to go) • Have a think about how you would travel around London and allocate some money for this also • Choose a hotel in central London for an overnight stay <p>Your budget is £100 per person and you must travel at least with one adult. Plan out a timetable of events for that weekend and work out how much these would cost plus how close you are to your budget. Get planning and have some fun deciding!</p>

<p>Gardening</p> 	<p>If you have a garden, make sure that you are keeping the flowers and other plants watered. You might like to plant some seeds and watch them start to grow.</p>
