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Dear Y1 parents and carers,

Re: Trip to Littlehampton Beach

This term, our big question is 'What do we treasure?' The topic will have an art focus and we will be learning about artists such as Hokusai and Goldsworthy.

We will be going to the beach on Monday 26th June as an opportunity for some observational drawings and transient art. Whilst we are there, we will have an ice-cream and a paddle in the sea.

Your child will need to be dropped off at 9:15am in the Harvester carpark and collected from the same place at 2:30pm. This is to enable parents to drop off and collect other siblings in school. We would encourage you to arrange a car share with another parent if drop off/collection at the beach is difficult for you. If this is not possible, please contact the school office and we will help you make alternative arrangements for your child.

Children should wear practical clothing and footwear. They will need a towel. They need to bring their lunch with extra fruit and drinks in a rucksack or bag. If the weather is sunny please make sure your child has applied sun cream before school and brings a sun hat. If you feel necessary then you may pack sun cream in your child's bag for *them* to apply throughout the day. Please note, we are unable to do this for them, so it is vital that they arrive with sun cream already applied.

Please give parental consent for this trip via Parent Mail. Make sure that the school has your up to date emergency contact numbers. If you are able to help with the trip please let the class teacher know. Please note you will not be placed in a group with your own child although we will all be on the beach together.
