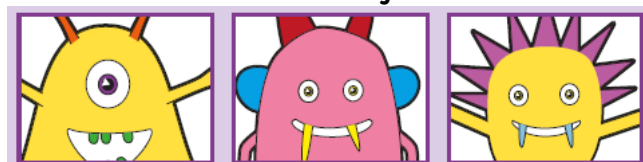


Welcome back! We hope you had a lovely half term break with your children.

This half term we will continue to explore the question, 'What does it mean to Belong? We will be thinking about changes that are happening in our community of Angmering and ways to embrace chance and sometimes to challenge it when necessary. We will continue to examine the physical and human features of our area and the wider world



During the second week of the half term the children will undertake the Phonics screening Check with their class teacher. The children have been practising for this check and have become quite expert at reading alien words! Please continue to practise sounds and words with your children in preparation for this and we will let you know how they get on towards the end of term.



English Learning



This half term we will be:-

- Writing sentences about where we belong based on stories such as 'Lubna and the Pebble' and 'Here we are'
- Writing stories based on the concept of 'Belonging'.
- Sequencing sentences to form short narratives based on these familiar stories.
- Learning to use connectives based on this half term's character, 'Connecting Caterpillar'.



Mathematical Learning

This term we are looking at the following areas of mathematics:

Composition of numbers 11-19:

- The numbers 11-19 can be formed by combining a ten and some ones.
- The numbers 11-19 can be partitioned into a ten and some ones.
- A number is even if the ones number is even and it can be made from groups of 2.
- Number is odd if the ones number is odd and therefore it can't be made from groups of 2.
- Doubling numbers 6-9 gives an even teen number; halving an even teen number gives a number from 6-9.
- Addition and subtraction facts to 10 can be applied to facts for 20.

Money:

- learning the coins and placing them in order
- being able to know what each coin is worth and what that means
- making small amounts by adding multiple coins together

PSHE Learning

This half term we will be learning about **Economic well-being**. We will explain how children might get money and explain some different ways to keep money safe. We will discuss the role of banks and building societies. We will teach children to recognise that people may make different choices about spending or saving. We will also explain that a range of jobs exist in and out of school and that different skills are needed for these jobs.

Computing Learning

We will be exploring programming by giving clear instructions to a virtual Bee-Bot and explaining how it works.



Music Learning

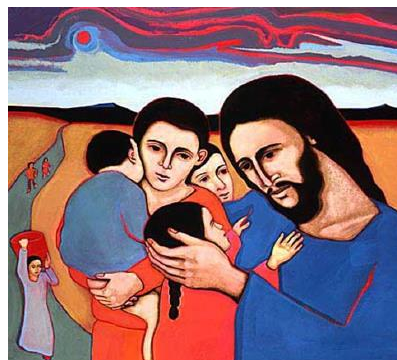
This half term's musical spotlight is all about 'Having fun with Improvisation'. Each lesson will focus around a social question and children will be encouraged to improvise a response either independently or with a partner.

PE Learning

This half term we will be focusing on learning athletic style games in preparation for our Sport Day later in June.

Faith and Wonder Learning

We will continue to look at the topic of Belonging, this time from the point of view of the Christian religion, learning about what it means to be part of a church community. We will bring together the year's learning ideas and talk about what links can be made between ideas.





How can you help?

- Listen to your child read their reading book from school at least 5 times a week. Please make sure you write a short comment in their reading diary and check off on their homework sheet so that we can see this is happening at home. Your child can change their own book once they have read at home.
- Complete the homework tasks that are provided each week.
- Keep reading stories to your child to enrich their vocabulary and enjoyment of stories.
- Keep visiting Numbots and work through the levels.
